

32. Dock box rules

All current dock boxes as of January 1, 2023, appropriately affixed to the dock are allowed to remain in place. If the slip is sold or leased the existing dock boxes must meet current requirements. Under those circumstances only one dock box per slip is permitted. Each owned dock can add one white dock box, if none exist, with a maximum size of 96 inches in length, 24 inches in width, and 26 inches high. All dock boxes permitted shall be mounted securely to the wood edges of the dock. No mounting of the dock box to the concrete portion of the dock is permitted. Prior to mounting any dock box, the dock owner must present an appropriate schematic showing the location of the requested dock box and the method of securing it to the dock. This should be presented to the dock committee and then forwarded for approval or rejection to the board of directors. Dock boxes will be allowed in the following locations if none exist. Slips #1 and #2 on Dolphin, Grouper, Marlin, and Sailfish docks can request a dock box be placed at the furthest end of the finger pier next to the slip to allow for adequate fire and rescue access. On Tarpon dock the same position applies to the slips adjacent to the walkway. Slips 3,4,5,6,7, & 8 can place a box at the head of the slip between the trapezoidal dock edge and the concrete piling. The requested position shall not interfere with or restrict the stability and function of the dock. Dock boxes shall not project more than 24 inches onto the main walkway. On the T docks, a dock box can be positioned on the channel side of the dock between the concrete piling and the main walkway.
